Biography of Andrew J. "Andy" Perkins, CW3 Ret.

Andy Perkins served on active duty from 1970 to 1980, with tours of duty at OTJA HQ VII Corps, Stuttgart, Germany ('70-'73); OTJA US Army Armor Center & Ft Knox, KY ('73-'75); OTJA US Army



Artillery Center & Ft Sill, OK ('75-'76); OTJA HQ 2<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Division, Dongducheon, Korea ('76-'77); and OTJA 21<sup>st</sup> Support Command, Kaiserslautern, Germany ('77-'80).

He was drafted in 1970 and went to Germany as a Company Clerk, but soon OJT'd as a court reporter and received his 71E MOS in June '71. In 1974 he was recognized as the #1 court report in the Army. In March 1975 he was promoted to Warrant Officer in the JAGC.

Since leaving the military Andy worked primarily in the advertising printing industry as a sales manager and sales trainer, and in developing online advertising with Knight Ridder Digital from 2001-2004. From 1989 – 2004 Andy made a number of trips as a volunteer to Liberia, West Africa, working in business development training and microloans. Liberia is statistically the poorest country in the world. In 2004 that opportunity closed and Andy started a non-profit called BESTWA, Building Everyone's Success Together in West Africa. He saw the terrible toll of child exploitation and in 2008 he opened a feeding program for 150 malnourished and starving children. That program has grown to feeding over 1,050 children a day while adding health care, education, and skills training. Some of the children have received a university education on BESTWA scholarships, and this fall one is receiving a Masters in Epidemiology. He also imports several million dollars a year in basic medicine for free distribution to three hospitals and 22 clinics.
